Executive Summary

Australia is very much a pro-death nation now, with oppressive and far-reaching abortion and Euthanasia laws in every State and Territory, but Christian pro-lifers are rallying.

Royal award for the architect of pro-death laws in Australia

The former premier of Victoria, Dan Andrews, has just been awarded a Royal award under the King's Birthday list

Andrews was the architect of the worst abortion laws in Australia at the time. He went on to introduce the 'breaking of the confessional seal' laws, forcing priests and ministers to report to police on what they hear in the confessional. Andrews was also the first to introduce Euthanasia and of course his government is continually looking to expand that law.

Worse, his laws were copied by other states. He is pictured here on the left.

The former Premier of Western Australia, Mark McGowan, was similarly given a Royal award, for much the same reason.

There are moves to strip these two of the awards, but this is unlikely to happen. This is the point we have now reached – we reward the architects of death.



Pro life Marches

The prolife walks continue in every city, with the latest in Brisbane Queensland.

Perth is having a 'Seven Churches Walk for Life' in July. It is an 8.6km circular walk (about five and a half miles) that is based on the 'Seven Churches Walk' in Rome. It is the first walk for Perth, in contrast to other cities that are now on their third or even fourth walks.

These walks are designed to bring the Christian Pro-Life message to the secular world.

We have experimented with shorter walks in the recent past, with participants wearing pro-life teeshirts, with positive results. This has inspired us to tackle the big walk planned for July 26th.

Rally for Life

Pro Life rallies are also planned in each state, typically at each house of Parliament. In Western Australia the rally happened on May 15th with 2000 people in attendance. Due to an unfortunate set of events we were not permitted to take donations on the night, but we were secretly given money anyway! Guest speaker was Josiah, a person saved from abortion by his mother despite the fact he has no arms.



Hiding in plain sight

One of the tools an oppressive regime uses is the disguising of evil with the perception of good.

An example of this is legislation being introduced into the Western Australian State Parliament designed to outlaw the use of the Nazi Swastika. On the face of it the move looks like a good one. They don't want battles between different sections of the community. But is it just to disguise their own innate Nazism? Here is a recent Facebook post by Right to Life Association of WA President Steve Klomp on the subject (still visible at 1023AM on 19th June 2024 AWST):

Is the current WA State Labor Government a group of Nazis themselves?

The Western Australian State Labor Government is moving to outlaw the displaying of the Nazi swastika. On the face of it this is a good move (although I suppose it could be argued that it is a restriction of free speech. Not that we have the right to free speech in the constitution of Australia).

However the hypocrisy in the move is clearly evident. The Nazis had a saying "Life not worthy of Life" and they used it to justify the killing of millions of people - Jews, Poles, Romanys - and they used this declared unworthiness to conduct bizarre medical experiments, force medical treatments such as experimental inoculations and carry out countless abortions. And they did all this whilst telling their people and the world how it led to scientific progress, cures for diseases, the removal of burdens and costs on society. They had no respect for life.

Does that sound like a State Government you know? We now have the worst abortion laws in Australia. We now allow our children to die if they are born alive after an abortion. We now allow medical experiments on children who are deliberately aborted for that purpose. We now have Euthanasia laws that the government is looking to expand. And of course we passed the mandatory 'vaccine' laws (just coincidentally I'm sure) shortly before the world declared the problem of COVID 19 - allowing the inoculation of the population using experimental drugs. All designed to remove burdens and costs on society and advance scientific progress. All designed to look like the protection of citizen's rights, particularly women's rights. The Western Australian state government has no respect for life.

The Nazis also attacked Christianity because they knew that Christianity can be a rallying cry against dictatorships, evil regimes and oppressive government in all its forms. They closed churches, dictated religious doctrine that could be taught in schools and seminaries and made reporting of so called confessed crimes mandatory.

Does that sound like a government you know? The WA State Labor Government closed churches during the so called necessary lockdown (whilst allowing abortion clinics to remain open) and now we have a law - the breaking of the confessional seal - that requires a priest or other religious person or counsellor to report confessed crime to the police. And of course it won't be long before Christian Schools will be forced to employ teachers who are not Christian or who openly oppose Christian principles. They are calling it equality.

Australian elections

Currently the Australian government is a Labor government (similar to the Democrats in the USA) This government is pro-death but there is a Federal election in May next year. This is an opportunity for pro-life politicians to stand for election – and many are doing so.

Similarly, almost every State government in Australia is a Labor government. But elections are looming! In Western Australia the election is in March next year.
